


Purpose

- The purpose of the Report is to provide recommendations for enabling healthy community development policies in the Official Plan Update.
- The report is in response to the findings of the Bruce GPS initiative and Guiding Principle #6 to create well-being through access to complete and healthy communities.



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What is a Healthy Community?

Healthy communities are a priority for Bruce County. As identified through the Bruce GPS initiative, and articulated by residents, a **healthy community** is summarized as follows:


Healthy and sustainable communities consider and build access to services and resources and they also build opportunities for activity and provide access to healthy food while fostering a sense of belonging, trust, and inclusiveness in the community.

Planning compact communities with places to walk and spaces for people to engage with one-another, we can support vibrant, inclusive downtowns, and an inclusive culture, healthy community, and social well-being.






Factors that Influence Healthy Communities

Key Topics + Trends Affecting Bruce County

- Public health and chronic disease
- Aging population
- Varying contexts broad range of towns, villages, and rural townships
- Need for a full range of housing types and tenures
- Mobility options
- Access to services and amenities recreation, health care, long-term care, education, retail and commercial, etc., parks and open spaces
- Access to healthy food
- Climate change



Recommended Directions

Public health and land use planning are intrinsically linked. Applying a healthy community focus to the Official Plan Update encompasses several factors that work together to improve public health with the overall intent to promote complete communities, support social well-being, active residents, and a viable and beautiful place to live, work, learn, and play.

The recommendations are organized under:

- A Healthy Community;
- A Complete Community;
- A Viable Community;
- A Beautiful and High Quality Community;
- A Sustainable Community; and,
- A Resilient Community.



Recommended Directions - A Healthy Community

- Support an active transportation system that is highly integrated and connected within the community, the County, and broader region.
- Design the community around pedestrian activity with destinations including parks,
 cultural and community facilities, shopping, and restaurants within walking distance.
- Plan for "age-in-place" facilities that anticipate changing housing needs for an aging population.
- Support opportunities for a sustainable local food system.
- Strengthen the **role of public health** in collaborating with municipalities to promote the development of healthy communities.
- Support accessibility for persons with disabilities in all land-use planning and development decisions.
- Promote building and site design through Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) principles.



Recommended Directions - A Complete Community

- Recognize the importance of providing the opportunity for residents to remain in the community for their entire lifecycle by accommodating a range and mix of housing types.
- Recognize the importance of social interaction and where services can be provided within
 easy walking and cycling distances to meet the needs of people of all ages, backgrounds,
 and capabilities.
- Ensure easy access for all residents to a wide range of uses including retail, parks and open spaces, employment opportunities, educational and cultural opportunities, mobility options, and diversity of housing types.
- Support higher density built forms and higher intensity land uses as a way of reducing land consumption and maximizing the efficiency and cost effectiveness of municipal service infrastructure.



Recommended Directions - A Beautiful Community

- Develop a high quality community that encourages and supports active living, social
 engagement, civic pride, and the creation of a sense of place and well-being.
- Include landmarks and gateways that clearly identify where you are, and when you have entered.
- Build **beautiful streets** and streetscapes that accommodate all modes of transportation and are designed to be pedestrian friendly and safe.
- Ensure that **parks and open spaces**, as well as Bruce County's natural features, are beautiful, accessible, and linked.
- Require high quality architecture through a diversity of scale and style.



Recommended Directions - A Viable Community

- Continue to attract long-term economic development opportunities by protecting for and establishing opportunities for businesses and commercial activities.
- Continue the County's leadership role in attracting new economic drivers by adapting to trend changes, while still providing a full range of population-related employment options.
- Ensure that new development supports a full range of economical, safe, and accessible mobility options, including transit, when it becomes available.
- Ensure that development is sustainable and financially viable over its life cycle.



Recommended Directions - A Sustainable Community

- Protect and enhance local and regional ecosystems and biological diversity.
- Promote the responsible use of resources to ensure long-term sustainability, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and reduce demands for energy, water, and waste systems.
- Demonstrate leadership in sustainable forms of green building design and technology, including the incorporation of renewable and alternative energy sources.
- Protect the urban forest and the tree canopy and identify objectives for how it can be enhanced and expanded.
- Support opportunities for **best management practices** for stormwater to protect against flooding and erosion while improving water quality.



Recommended Directions - A Resilient Community

• Explore opportunities in the Official Plan to support **Emergency Preparedness Planning** with respect to development, infrastructure, and systems to ensure access basic needs are designed in a way that mitigates the impacts of climate change and related extreme weather events, such as flooding, heat waves, severe winter storms, and supply chain disruption.



Next Steps

- This Interim Report is intended to provide a foundation for policy directions for healthy communities and wellbeing.
- Now that the stage is set, the County will lay out a road map for the community engagement process on the Recommended Directions.
- This process will culminate in a final Communities
 Discussion Paper to be integrated into the County's new
 Official Plan.
