Background:

Virtual Adventure Talks, February 10, 24, & March 10


The Adventure Talks virtual series came to a close on March 10 with Mert Taner winning over the audience through his charm and passion for his country, Turkey, which he referred to as the cradle of civilization. In total 70 tickets were sold for the three-part series, and 100% of surveyed respondents stated they would attend a future Adventure Talks Series. Other survey data showed that 55% of respondents heard about the program through the BCM&CC newsletter, and the second highest channel was the Museum's website at 27%. A copy of each presentation is available for participants to access by private link on YouTube, with 242 views in total. This tells us that participants have re-watched each Talk, confirming survey comments that the content and topics were interesting and well received.

On March 11, the Museum was proud to have six volunteers recognized during the virtual 2020 Ontario Volunteer Service Awards for consecutive years of service to the BCM&CC. The Museum has submitted nominations for five individuals for the 2021 award season, has implemented a Return to Volunteer Plan, and looks forward to once again welcoming back our amazing volunteers in April.
