


Penetanguishene Naval Slip Site

Why At The BCM&CC?

There are 150 shipwrecks along the coast of Bruce County dating from 1799 to 1980. A total of 25 in Fathom Five Park alone.

Other Bruce County marine structures/wharfs/piers at Inverhuron - Baie de Dore, Southampton, Fishing Islands, Tobermory and, Lion's Head and other locations.

The County also has known and potential Indigenous sites along inundated shorelines.

Beyond Bruce County there are an estimated 5,000 to 10,000 shipwrecks in the Great Lakes bordering Ontario.

The BCM&CC is right at the heart of it all.

THE SCHOONER ARABIA SUNK.

Wiarton, Oct. 5.—The schooner Arabia, Capt. Henry Boville, left Chicago on October 1st with twenty thousand bushols of corn, consigned to Midland. While off the ducks she encountered a heavy gale and began to leak very badly, and in a few minutes she sunk in one hundred feet of water at the entrance of Georgian bay, near Echo island, on Sunday morning chout three Echo island, on Sunday morning about three o'clock. The crew were all saved in the small boat and brought to Wiarton by the tug Clark.






