Background:

Black History Month: Erasing Erasure, February 25

For Black History Month, the Museum hosted a presentation by Dorothy Abbott of the Grey County Black Heritage Society, whose family escaped slavery via the underground railroad circa 1850, and local historian Aly Boltman. The duo spoke about their award-winning work that led to the recognition of more than 1,200 people, some from Bruce County, buried in unmarked graves in Owen Sound in what is now called Potter's Field. At the time of writing of this report we have 23 confirmed attendances.

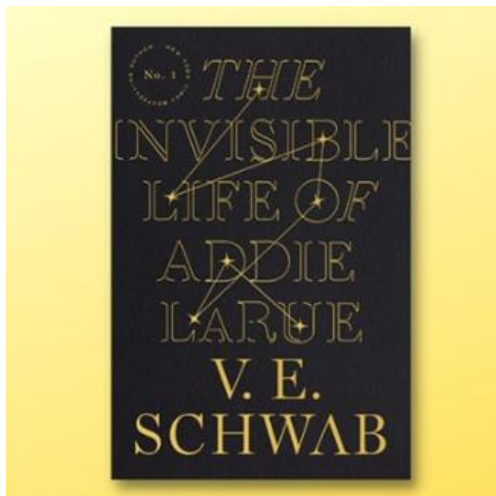
