## **Background:**

# Dear Diary ... Personal Accounts from WWI

Archivist Deb Sturdevant and Curatorial Assistant Laura Leonard will be delivering a virtual presentation through <u>University of Windsor's Canterbury ElderCollege</u> on October 24. During this session, they will share personal accounts of soldiers whose letters and diaries are housed at the museum and tips on researching soldiers of the First World War, including the use of BCM&CC's Bruce Remembers website. Included will be an introduction to the Bruce County Museum & Cultural Centre, and the Bruce Remembers military exhibit.

# Mohawk College Library Technician Field Placement

Nicole Lake, a student from Mohawk College's Library and Information Technician Program completed a 105-hour unpaid field placement in the Archives during the summer. She entered information about over 200 books, photographs, and other archival records into the collections management database for upload to Online Collections.

# Researcher Visits, Inquiries, and Paid Services

In Q3 2023, Archives staff directly served 675 individuals:

- 93 people attended the Archives & Research Room in person for research
- 426 people visited the Research Room for general inquiries or browsing.
- 144 people received answers from staff to general inquiries by email or phone.
- 12 individuals paid for research and copy services or photographs.

# **Online Collections**

<u>Online Collections</u> now features a total of 19,632 archival record descriptions with 27,890 images, enabling researchers to view images online and read descriptions of other items available to view in the Research Room. 715 of those record descriptions and 1,263 images were added this quarter by staff, volunteers, and students.

Some of the items described in this quarter include:

- Canada Spool and Bobbin, Walkerton, articles, reminiscences, and photographs
- Family Histories, including families from Arran, Brant, Bruce, and Greenock Townships
- Knechtel Woodturning and Furniture Co. catalogue, 1903
- Paisley Mill limited edition drawing by James Paddon
- <u>Women's Institute minute books and Tweedsmuir community histories</u> from branches including Bervie, Lucknow, Oliphant, Purple Grove, Ried's Corners, Silver Lake, and Williscroft
- Photographs, including:
  - Bell Buoy near Chantry Island, ca. 1910s
  - <u>Douglas Point Nuclear Generating Station, 1960s and 1970s (by Lindsay</u> <u>Thornburn)</u>
  - o Tiverton Macs Ladies Baseball Team, 1945
  - o Soldier Stuart Macpherson (1898-1918)
  - Saugeen Shores Air Show 2000 photograph albums

An Archives volunteer also created more detailed biographies for Chantry Island Lighthouse Keepers Captain <u>Duncan McGregor Lambert</u> and Captain <u>William McGregor Lambert</u>, as well as Wiarton's Captain <u>Harold David Miller</u> for whom the BCM&CC holds a number of artefacts and archival records.
