Background:

Collections

Collections had a successful year, fully processing new donations, taking on reorganization projects within artefact storage, creating collections based digital programming alongside programming staff, and continuing to digitize collections for the online collection and for use within the Stories & Artefacts section of the museum's website.

One of the goals of Collections is to digitize and upload artefacts monthly to the online collection. More than 450 objects were added, bringing the total to more than 3,100 items or 15% of the collection. Objects selected for digitization are newly donated, used in exhibitions, used within the Stories & Artefacts section of the website or those discovered within other collections projects. Alongside breaking down geographical access barriers to the collection, digitization acts as a conservation technique by mitigating the need to physically access artefacts reducing risks of damage through handling etc.

Collections aims to add 20 new stories to the Stories & Artefacts section of the website annually. This goal was met, and this section now has 99 featured stories which highlight more than 400 objects and archival materials. Stories uploaded this year include Bruce Peninsula Zinc Mines, Canada Spool & Bobbin, Folk Schools, The Chesley Colts, Ice Harvesting, the Oliphant Regatta and Pharmacists and Chemists.

Throughout 2023, alongside programming staff, collections created Deep Dives, short videos introducing and telling the brief history of items within the collection. Subjects of videos included wedding gowns, musical instruments, hair artwork and jewelry, hats, and hairstyles. In all, there were 32 new donations to the collection in 2023. Most donations were from Bruce County residents, but some came from as far away as Saskatoon and Vancouver. A highlight from 2023 includes a dress belonging to Julia Donnelly, the wife of Senator J.J. Donnelly of Pinkerton. The dress was worn in Ottawa when Parliament was visited by King George VI and Queen Elizabeth on their Royal Tour in 1939.




Dress worn by Julia Donnelly during Royal Visit to Parliament.

Education and Outreach

Education Programs

The Museum delivered 6 educational programs in December, reaching 120 students. Four of these programs were delivered in classrooms through our Mobile Museum service. Our Winter Celebrations program was popular this month, where participants learned about the history and traditions of five different celebrations that occur around this time of year: Solstice, Hanukkah, Kwanzaa, Bodhi Day, and Christmas.

In 2023 we ran In-Museum programs for 57 classes hosting over 1200 students. We also travelled to 20 different classes to deliver our In-School Outreach programs, reaching an addition 392 students. Our Education Program totals for 2023 was 77 programs delivered to 1592 students.

After a festive circle time, participants decorated donation bags that they then took into the Bevan's General Store exhibit and filled with ingredients to create a non-perishable meal kit complete with a recipe card. We will start of the year with two new exhibitions opening in mid to late January.


The Thread of the Story: When Artefacts Inspire Art

The Bruce County Museum & Cultural Centre's Year in Review for 2023 is now complete. Some highlights from the year include:

Live musicians featured seasonal karaoke, and the Bruce Power Theatre showcased Steve Baker's Victorian Magic Show. Complimentary food was enjoyed in the lower café. Families gathered in the Bruce Gallery for Santa's visit, crafting sugar cookies, creating Victorian Pomanders, and writing letters to Santa. The Exhibit Hall immersed guests in holiday spirit with a German Koogle ornament craft and readings by the Bruce County Library. Special features included a museum-wide scavenger hunt and exclusive gift bags for members. The historic Mackenzie Log Cabin, adorned with lights, added a nostalgic touch. The "Light-up-the-Holidays" event exceeded expectations, offering a variety of activities that brought joy and a sense of community. The museum's commitment to a memorable and inclusive experience made this annual celebration a highlight for residents and visitors alike.
