- More equitable representation in print means more equitable outcomes for individuals







Eight Focused Markers

- A committee of Branch Supervisors convened to set priorities for efforts to increase DEI content in children's collection
- Using Collection HQ, a collection management tool, we can track the DEI content of our collection based on various DEI markers
- Selected eight DEI markers to focus on growing:
 - Asian
 - Black
 - Disabilities & Neurodiversity
 - Indigenous
 - Middle Eastern & North African
 - Multicultural
 - Sexuality & Gender
 - Substance Abuse & Addictions





How to Grow?


- Excluding DEI materials from weeding activities

Materials classified as DEI grew from 9.5% to 13.9% in the eight focused categories




Goals

- Count on growth of DEI content from publishers






Overall Collection, 2022:
