#### **Background:**

## **Volunteer and Co-op Student Contributions**

Volunteers and students continue to contribute to the preservation and accessibility of the archival collection, while developing their skills and knowledge.

11 volunteers contributed 400 hours to Archives work in Q2. This work included adding and editing soldiers in <u>BruceRemembers.org</u>, adding 800 descriptions of archival records and digitized photographs to <u>Online Collections</u>, and working on inventories of the Archives' hardcopy newspaper collection.

Saugeen District Secondary School student Michael Feit completed his placement in the Archives. From February to June 2024, he added details and/or news clippings to 30+ soldiers on Bruce Remembers and about 125 items to Online Collections, including

inventories of land records, recently donated photographs, and Royal Canadian Legion files containing clippings about Second World War soldiers. He also assisted in digitizing diaries.

Western University's Master of Arts, Public History intern, Dani Walls, is completing a 12-week co-op work placement in the Archives. She is working with items in the Arthur Amos Shipwreck Research Collection and has added 115 descriptive records to Online Collections to date. She is also writing articles for BCM&CC's Stories & Artefacts web page.

#### Stories & Artefacts

The <u>Stories & Artefacts web page</u> brings historic Bruce County business, places, and people to life and is a resource from which County residents and site visitors may learn about our communities' development and the people who contribute to them. This quarter, Collections and Archives uploaded six articles, providing more details about the HMS General Hunter ship and businesses and people related to recently donated items. Article topics are:

- H.M.S. General Hunter
- R. Truax Son & Company Limited, Walkerton
- Dominion Plywoods Ltd., Southampton
- 160th Battalion's mascot Teddy the bear
- Art for art's sake (in the form of tapestries and painted plates), and
- Jessie Macpherson of Kincardine Township who became the first female superintendent of the Portage La Prairie women's prison.



## **Users Accessing Services**

An upward trend generally continues in the number of people accessing the Archives' virtual and in-person resources. Although Online Collections has a small decrease in users and views in Q2 as compared to Q1, there has been a 12.5% increase in number of users over Q2 last year.

	(The site had a large spike in users in mid-May; the cause is uncertain. Marathon of History magazine did provide advertising space for Bruce Remembers in its military-themed spring issue.)	(This decrease may be related to a decrease in volunteer editing views this quarter)

Archives staff also served 528 individuals this quarter through direct interactions, including answering 465 inquiries, assisting 39 in-person researchers, and completing 13 paid research/reproduction orders. In addition, the Archives received donations from 27i individuals this quarter. Although direct-contact services are still lower than they were before the pandemic, they have increased this year by 27% over last year's Q2.

#### Re-housing and migration work

This quarter, Archives staff continued working on re-housing donations to ensure optimal use of space: 70% of private donations have been reviewed and re-housed, as necessary. In addition, staff performed preservation work related to migrating video and audio files from 85 outdated CD and DVD discs.
