The following highlights our investments in your community in 2022.

- Northern Bruce Peninsula provided \$7,150,224.00 in tax revenue to Bruce County
- Provided 60 childcare spots for an investment of \$342,605.44
- Responded to 574 calls for paramedic services for a total investment of \$1,133,156.44
- Maintained 32 KMs of road for an investment of \$768,621.61
- Welcomed 1,575 active library users for an investment of \$325,842.86
- Provided life stabilization supports to 22
  Ontario Works clients for an investment of \$507,685.01





- Provided 14 units of social housing for investment of \$278,250.36
- Responded to **53 planning inquiries** for an investment of \$275,729.58
- We also provide Long-Term Care, Economic Development, and Museum services across the County, as well as funding for public health, creating value for all our communities.
