## Background/Analysis:

#### Archives Awareness Week, April 7 to 12

Archives Awareness Week 2025 focused on the value of BCM&CC's archival military collection which reflects the experiences of individuals, families, and communities during times of military conflict.

With the support of sponsor Bruce County Historical Society, the Archives promoted its services and resources, and it encouraged donations of Bruce County military items.

Three articles were added to BCM&CC's <u>Stories & Artefacts</u> web page: two related to the 160<sup>th</sup> Battalion, and a "Sharing Military Experiences" article highlighting the types of military items the Archives accepts for donation and makes accessible to the public.

The week will culminate on April 12 in a free "sold-out" presentation "Bruce in Battle: Life in the 160<sup>th</sup> Battalion" during which Kent Kraemer will share stories about 160<sup>th</sup> Battalion soldiers and his experiences using archival resources. Those who stay for a behind-the-scenes tour of the Archives will learn more about the ways in which the Archives preserves our history and makes its resources available to the public.

#### **Student Contributions**

Laura Downs joined the Archives Team for an unpaid 105-hour placement as part of her Mohawk College Library Technician Program studies. She assisted in processing 490 items, including church-themed booklets and reference materials, Women's Institute minutes and community histories, and Kincardine-area images. These item descriptions were added to Online Collections. She also wrote biographies related to recently donated materials: <a href="Lester K. Hacking"><u>Lester K. Hacking</u></a> (Gobles Grove resident who participated in Oliphant Regatta) and <a href="Jack Campbell">Jack Campbell</a> (Lucknow barber and Point Clark lightkeeper).

- Flowerpot Island Light station logbooks (A2024.083)
- <u>Jackson Women's Institute</u> (Brockton) minutes and Tweedsmuir community history binders
- <u>Lucknow business receipts</u> reflecting 1940s-era businesses, such as the Coal Co., Rae & Porteous Hardware, and Maple Leaf Aircraft Corporation Limited (A2024.086)
- Saugeen Township <u>Leeder family diaries</u>: three more 1870s-1880s diaries were digitized and uploaded (A991.047).
- <u>Southampton Beacon newspaper collection</u> with Beacon <u>hardcopy newspaper</u> inventory.
- Teeswater Women's Institute Minutes, (A2024.077)
- Wiarton <u>IODE White Cloud Chapter records</u> (Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire), including: photos, minutes, newspaper clippings, and annual reports (A2024.076).
