Education / Outreach

Education Programs

The Museum delivered 4 education programs in March, reaching 67 students. Programs focused on the topics of local Indigenous and Early Settler communities and included tours of all our exhibits.

The Museum delivered a joint outreach program in March to Gateway Haven residents along with the Wiarton Day Away program. Participants explored our Music Travel Trunk and recalled stories about our music-related artefacts followed by a fun singalong.

KidZone March Break Discovery Day Camp - March 11-15

KidZone Discovery Day Camp was a jam-packed week of adventure and fun for kids ages 5-10. Each day they discovered themed activities, crafts, games, experiments, and exploration. Participants also had the opportunity to learn from special guests including Baker Magic, The Bluewater Astronomical Society, the Mousetrap Machine Balloon Show, Sciensational Sssnakes, and Medieval Knights.

Exhibitions

Meet the Artists - March 23

This event provided an opportunity for visitors to engage directly with the artists from both The Thread of the Story and Whisper Project exhibitions currently on display until April 30. Over 80 visitors had the chance to learn more about each of the artist's inspiration, process, and techniques in an informal relaxed social environment. Many of the artists presented work in both exhibitions.



Programming

March Break Family Fun!

The museum hosted a series of engaging programs and shows for families during the March break, resulting in a successful event with high attendance and community involvement.

Event Details:

- Film Screening Kick-off (March 9th): The week began with a film screening in the theatre, setting the stage for a week of entertainment.
- Steve Baker Magic Show (March 11th): Steve Baker's Teach-a-Trick Show was a hit, with 88 registered attendees and 16 walk-ins, leading to a sold-out performance. Baker's interactive magic show captivated both kids and adults.
- "Light is Blue" Science Show (March 12th): John Hlyialuk's interactive science show, "Light is Blue," had a double sold-out show with 91 and 92 registrants, respectively. Attendees experienced the wonders of light reflection and visual science firsthand.
- "How to Catch a Mouse Show" (March 13th): Family Fun Entertainment's show, focusing on designing simple machines from balloons to catch a "mouse," was another sold-out success with 81 preregistered attendees and 16 walk-ins.
- Scisensational Snakes Reptile Show (March 14th): The popular Scisensational Snakes show offered hands-on handling of exotic reptiles. The show had a preregistration rate of 95%, with 99 spots prebooked and the remaining seats filled by walk-ins.
- Medieval Knights Reenactment (March 15th): The Museum hosted 22 medieval reenactors from *Northgeatham* with interactive tables and live combat demonstrations. The event had an 85% preregistration rate, with 85 people preregistered and 19 walk-ins.
- Exhibit Tour and Book Launch (March 16th): A guided tour of the exhibits was followed by a Museum Deep Dive Presentation on the oldest fossils in the collection. Additionally, a book launch for Dorthy Ladd's companion piece to her 2023 title, "Memengwaa," was held, attended by the author's family and community members, as well as seven museum patrons.

The March Break Family Fun event was a resounding success, with high attendance, diverse programming, and strong community engagement. The event showcased the Museum as a vibrant hub for family-friendly activities and educational experiences.





Muse-Talk: "Lunatic" - March 20

The March MUSE-Talk featured Ian Evans, an adventurer from Ontario, sharing insights from his Antarctic expedition. The event included a screening of Ian's documentary "LUNATIC: Life Begins at the End of Your Comfort Zone," highlighting his quest to become the oldest Canadian to reach the South Pole. The documentary has been featured at 12 film festivals globally and has won 7 awards, including "Best Documentary." The event sold out with 96 tickets pre-sold, making it the most popular MUSE-Talk to date.
